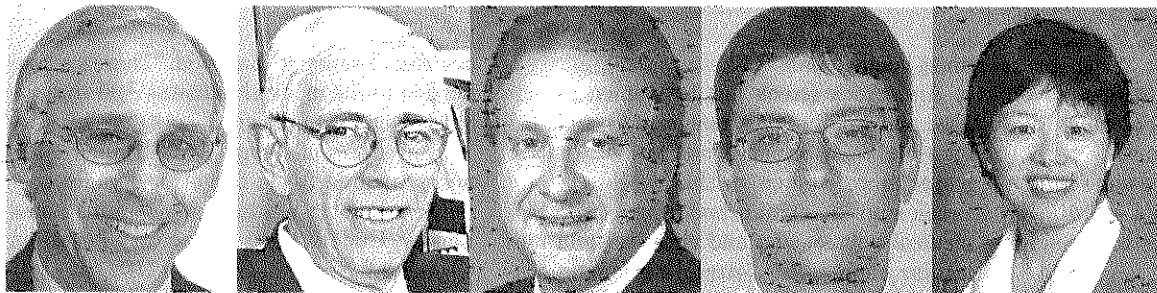

An attorney since 1975, **Eisenbud** in 2008 opened The Law Office of Frederick Eisenbud, an environmental law firm in Commack. A Peace Corps volunteer in Liberia before attending law school, he graduated from Hofstra University's School of Law, where he was editor in chief of the Law Review. Eisenbud worked for the U.S. Department of Justice's Criminal Division and then joined the Suffolk County District Attorney's office, where he founded and was chief of the Environmental Crime Unit from 1984 to 1987. He was deputy chief of the federal and general

litigation bureau of the Suffolk County Attorney's office and counsel to the Suffolk County Board of Health. He is the co-chair of the Hauppauge Industrial Association's environmental committee and a member of the HIA's board.

Herbert Fox

Professor of Mechanical & Aerospace Engineering
Director, Center for Energy, Environment and Economics
New York Institute of Technology

A specialist in energy systems, propulsion and fluid mechanics based at NYIT's Old Westbury campus, **Fox** has extensive experience as an educator and engineer. He joined New York Univer-

sity in 1964 and in 1970 was named NYIT's chair of its Department of mechanical engineering, rising to be the first dean of science and technology at the college. He in 1977 left his academic post as dean to join Pope, Evans and Robbins, a consulting engineering firm in New York City where he served as its vice president of consulting services. Fox returned to NYIT in 1982 as its senior vice president for scientific research and in 1992 returned to teaching as a full professor of mechanical engineering. He leads NYIT's team analyzing photovoltaic systems for LIPA and National Grid and is working on an unmanned aerial vehicle with funding from the U.S. Depart-

ment of Defense and the Israel Ministry of Defense.
